

OBJECTIVES

1. Increase awareness about the benefits of maternal immunization in the prevention of influenza, pertussis, RSV and GBS.
2. Appreciate the impact of Zika virus transmission during pregnancy and possible fetal teratogenicity.
3. Recognize the burden of illness associated with viral disease in Botswana and the dominance of RSV infection.
4. Learn about the association of RSV infection with extended hospital stay, ICU care and mortality in adults of all ages with chronic underlying conditions.
5. Are rapid RSV antigen detection tests useful in young children? Can they be employed as a point of care test?
6. Review the evidence for RSV prophylaxis in significant congenital heart disease. Can a cut-off at 1 year of age be uniformly justified?
7. Learn about what is on the horizon for RSV prevention and treatment – vaccines, antibodies and antiviral agents.
8. Do current RSV prophylaxis guidelines advocate for children and families or are they a cost-cutting measure with limited supportive evidence.
9. Changes for the 2016–2017 season, new materials and recent experiences shared by all participants with the OPDP program.

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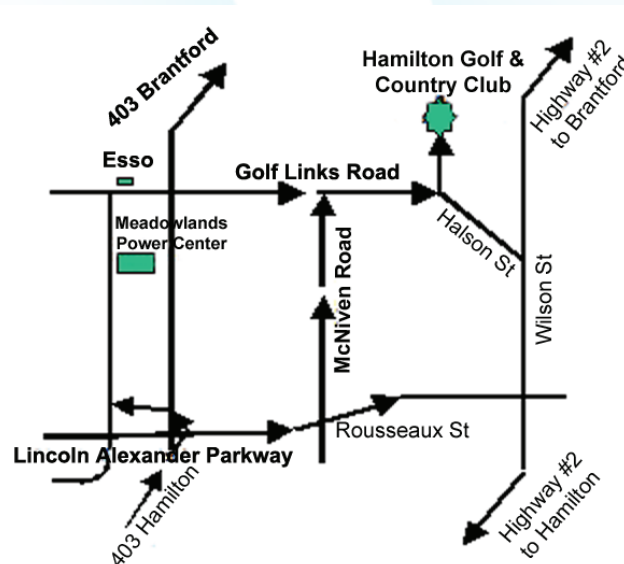
