

OBJECTIVES

1. What is the value of monitoring desaturation in infants with bronchiolitis? Learn whether oximetry is effective in predicting subsequent return for care.
2. Recognize whether nebulized saline impacts RSV admission rates or length of stay. Is it time to abandon the intervention for bronchiolitis?
3. Appreciate the treatment goals of high flow nasal cannula. Does HFNC impact length of stay or admission to the PICU?
4. Review lung function in healthy preterm infants and those with chronic lung disease compared to term infants.
5. Learn the evidence regarding the impact of RSV in children and long term pulmonary sequelae including the potential for chronic obstructive lung disease in adulthood.
6. Recognize that RSV in Down syndrome children irrespective of underlying morbidities is strongly associated with hospitalization.
7. Appreciate that children with medical complexity are at high risk for recurrent respiratory tract infections and that RSV may play an important role in causation.
8. Learn about a new risk scoring tool to determine RSV-related hospitalization in children in the Northern Hemisphere. Is it applicable in Canada?
9. Changes for the 2018-2019 season: New materials and recent experiences shared by all participants with the OPDP program.

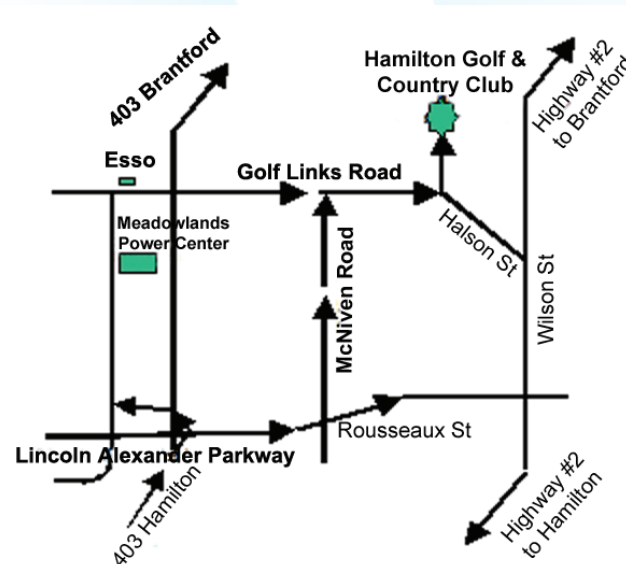
